



Modern Foreign Languages

How this subject is taught:

Pupils in Key Stage 2 study Spanish through the use of a specific scheme of work from iLanguages which is designed to cover the requirements of the National Curriculum programme of study. There are a mixture of video and audio clips which are linked to teaching materials that encourage the development of correct pronunciation as well as understanding of key words and phrases.

EYFS

Modern Foreign Languages do not form part of the EYFS curriculum.

Key Stage One (Years 1 and 2)

Modern Foreign Languages do not form part of the KS1 curriculum.

Key Stage Two (Years 3 to 6)

Spanish is taught for up to an hour a week across the Key Stage. Children are taught to develop the essential skills they need in order to learn a language and to be able to read and converse in Spanish.

How this subject is assessed

The lessons are pre-prepared in the scheme and are delivered to all the children with aspects differentiated according to the ability of the learners. All children are encouraged to have a go and not be afraid to make errors.

As well as assessing the ability of the children the scheme has assessment suggestions and opportunities built in which are used to check on the progress and ability of the children.

All lessons have clear Learning Objectives so children know if they have achieved and their next steps to learning. As a school we formally assess using the Target Tracker programme and this is updated each half term to ensure Learning Objectives are met and any 'gaps' in learning can be addressed.

Priorities for Future Developments

- Further embed the teaching of MFL across KS2 and ensure that children are meeting the NC expectations.
- Assess whether Spanish is the most accessible language to learn.
